Benjamin Street is a road in Crestview FL with 12 homes and a church located on it. Each building is currently on septic systems. The City would like to install a sewer forcemain and grinder pumps to get the residents and church off septic tanks and onto the city's sewer system. While the nearest manhole is one street to the east, Benjamin St has too much slope for a gravity system. This low-income neighborhood is also located directly next to a creek and wetland area. Getting the properties onto sewer would decrease the nutrient load to the creek.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City will install a 1800' sewer forcemain and 13 grinder pumps to get the residents and church off septic tanks and onto the city's sewer system. The primary goal of the project is to alleviate the citizen's burden of replacing septic systems in a low-income area of Crestview.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Each building on Benjamin Street is currently on septic systems. The City will install a sewer forcemain and grinder pumps to get the residents and church off septic tanks and onto the city's sewer system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Sewer services will be expanded to include all properties on Benjamin Street.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

There are 13 active properties on Benjamin Street. Twelve residences and one church. This neighborhood is designated a low income area. Roughly 50 individuals will benefit from the sewer system expansion.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

One expected benefit is to take 13 septic systems out of service and provide those same 13 properties with sewer service. The second expected benefit is to improve the water quality of the nearby creek. These can be measured by a reduction in service calls for septic tank repair and water quality sampling.

The City will own the new sewer frocemain within the right-of-way of Benjamin St. The property owners will own the grinder pumps that will be located on their properties.
