This project centers	around 4 Polk Co	inty historic dow	ntowns (Auburndala Ha	ings City I ako Wal	os and Winter Haven)					
This project centers around 4 Polk County historic downtowns (Auburndale, Haines City, Lake Wales, and Winter Haven) and Lakeland Linder Airport/Aerospace Center for Excellence. Each entity will build facilities to attract, develop, and support the next generation of innovation companies and entrepreneurs in industry clusters such as aviation/avionics, transportation/logistics, hospitality/culinary, and healthcare/lifestyle. Funds will be used to construct and/or renovate and equip approximately 20,000 sq. ft. facilities that will be segmented to support 4 core functions: tech co-working space; creator/maker's space; FDA approved culinary kitchens; residential studios/offices/classrooms. Each entity is responsible for the funding and/or provision of the land, land improvement, parking, and connected amenities necessary to support the Smart City Center. Each entity over 3 years will provide \$900,000 (\$4.5 million in total) and the private section has pledged \$1.5 million for operations.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To recruit and support local entrepreneurs and grow new business start-ups and recruit via soft-landing programs companies from out of the region and state. By doing so, we will create high-wage jobs, recruit companies in the region's identified documented industry clusters, and at the same time revitalize our historic downtowns.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Advice will be provided to cities and airport regarding the location, architecture, and engineering of the facilities based on industry best practices. Additionally, help and support in the design of the center's core work areas, recruitment of staff, and support in selection of equipment and furnishing will be provided so as to meet industry certifications and government regulations. Overall marketing and event will also be provided and centrally coordinated.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Recruitment of innovation companies and provision of business support services such as business plan development, marketing, social media support, product development, packaging, regulatory and insurance requirements, and business/industry networking.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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The Central Florida region will be primarily served by this project as well as the ridge and heartland communities. Students, entrepreneurs of all ages, start-up companies, as well as those businesses that are currently under-capitalized or in need of an improved business plan. Additionally, those businesses that are new to ecommerece, in need of social media support and tools; will benefit. Each location will have co-working space fitted with key fobs for entry so they may be accessed 24/7 allowing for greater usage. We believe 20-30 companies will make continuing use of each of the 5 facilities during the course of a year, with 50-75 member entrepreneurs per facility.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Central Florida region will greatly benefit as it grows its reputation and brand as one of the finest and supportive places to start, locate, or relocate a company or business. High paying 21st century focused jobs in technology, aviation, health care, hospitality, and culinary opportunities for decades to come. The State of Florida and municipal governments will benefit from enhanced tax base, revitalized downtown city centers, and greater year-round through econometric models (REMI) based on actual jobs created, business investment, and capital expenditures per company recruited and services.
