The funds will be used to expand TEDC's social service offerings to its existing low-income and workforce housing residents. The new social services programs will include three new programs.

1) Digital literacy for seniors. A platform that will train seniors on how to use digital devices to access services in the community.

2) Financial literacy programs including budgeting, saving and investing, credit counseling, and home ownership programs.
3) Educational and vocational job training through a strategic partnership with Miami-Dade College in which residents will have an opportunity to complete their GED's and pursue other job training certifications on site.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

By expanding the social services programs, TEDC will achieve its goal of helping its residents achieve self-sufficiency through job training and financial literacy and less reliant on subsidized housing and other government programs. With respect to our elderly residents, the goal is assist them in becoming more comfortable with technology and to teach them how to improve the quality of their lives through digital literacy.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The residents will be offered a combination of in-person and digitally formated training. Residents will also be able to participate in career counseling including resume assistance, interview preparation, workshops and job placements. Residents will have the opportunity to obtain a GED as well as enroll in job certification programs at Miami-Dade College.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

1) Seniors will be offered technology training to learn how to use digital devices to access community services, online banking and telehealth services.

2) Residents will be offered financial literacy training designed to build knowledge from the ground up to empower tenants into making informed financial decisions.

3) Through a partnership with Miami-Dade College, on-site certification programs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population includes teenagers, adults, and senior citizens ages 55 and older.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



The benefits will be numerous and will reflect improvements in mental and physical health, and increases in gainful employment and financial stability. The measurement of the results will be captured by surveys with a graduated scale to measure employment and wage increases as well as participant satisfaction. The program will also monitor hours spent on the digital programs and track the number of telehealth visits scheduled.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the program fails to meet the deliverables or performance measures, it should be given notice and the opportunity to come into compliance. Should the program fail to address the concerns, funding should be withheld until a time that the project complies with the requirements. Failure to meet deliverables would cancel the contract and forfeiture of the remaining balance of unspent appropriation.
