This program will provide behavioral health professionals as "co-responders" in law enforcement responses to public emergencies that involve mental health or addiction issues. This will allow for immediate, real-time assistance for law enforcement officers when encountering citizens with these needs. This is a collaborative project between Lakeview Center, Inc., Pensacola Police Department, and Escambia County Sheriff's Office.

LCI received an additional \$400K in federal CARES dollars through Santa Rosa County in 2021. This funded a mental health awareness campaign, tele-health expansion, and uncompensated care in SRC.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will be used for the purpose of providing behavioral health expertise as an augmentation to law enforcement response, with the goal of improved intervention when responses involve subjects with mental health or addiction issues. This will improve community safety and support, and engage subjects in behavioral health services when in crisis.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Lakeview Center will collaborate with Escambia County Sheriff's Office (ECSO) and Pensacola Police Department (PPD) to develop a co-responder model for law enforcement. This model will provide behavioral health professionals in support of law enforcement responses to public emergencies. Lakeview will hire, train, supervise, and deploy medical and clinical staff necessary to deliver the designed collaborative model.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services provided to citizens will include triage, screening, crisis counseling, and psychiatry services as needed and identified in law enforcement responses. Direct services will address mental health, substance abuse, and co-occurring treatment needs of citizens with whom law enforcement first responders engage.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons with poor mental health; Persons with poor physical health; Economically disadvantaged persons; At-risk youth; Homeless; and Drug Users.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?



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Outcomes:

- 1- Increased access to mental health treatment for Escambia County citizens in crisis.
- 2- Decreased incidence of law enforcement responses necessary for individuals served.
- 3- Decrease in arrest, incarceration, and crime by the individuals served by this program.
- 4- Increased access to substance abuse treatment for Escambia County citizens in crisis.
- 5- Decreased incidence of law enforcement responses necessary for individuals served.

Method:

- 1- Lakeview Center will collaborate with ECSO and PPD to track outcome data for individuals served.
- 2- Lakeview Center will track encounters with citizens served in the program. Encounter data will include services provided and frequency of repeat encounters by law enforcement.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties

for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to achieve a customer satisfaction score of 4.5 on a 5 point scale may result in corrective action. Failure to expend appropriated funds within the contract year may result in recoupment.
