## 12. Program Performance

# a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested to enhance our implementation of the Nspire Interrupters Program will allow us to have a full complement of Interrupters to apply a public health approach toward deterring the continued spread of violent acts in our community. Their goal will be to target and treat persons with the highest risk of transmission of violence; and through community organizing and education change community norms that when left unchecked have led to and enabled the growth/spread of violent crime.

## b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Nspire Interrupters' work will be specifically focused on detection, mentoring, education and community organization. They will detect potentially violent events and interrupt their commission through utilization of various mediation techniques. They will provide ongoing behavior change in the target communities by developing relationships with the high-risk transmitters, mentoring them and facilitating their access to social services. They will work within the target communities to help them organize and build a collaborative relationship with law enforcement, local government, community health services and social services.

# c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Direct services to be provided the citizens in the neighborhoods targeted by this project will include: (1) mediation of conflicts utilizing techniques such as cognitive dissonance, derailing and negotiating compromise; (2) mentoring services to individuals identified as violence transmitters in order to develop relationships with them and through those relationships impart messaging to reject violent behaviors; and (3) establishing and maintaining organized neighborhood councils whose work will be to ensure ongoing collaboration between the community/neighborhood they represent and local government leaders, local law enforcement, health services & social services providers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Nspire Interrupters Program will target identified violence transmitters residing in the Pine Ridge and Duval Heights neighborhoods where approximately a third of households live below poverty. These neighborhoods are the leading communities where law enforcement data show the highest incidence of violent indicators. It is projected that the Inspire Interrupters will have a total direct caseload of 50 violence transmitters, equating to one for nearly every seven homes given the data on violence specific to these neighborhoods.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- (1) Reduction in violent crime transmission. Results to be measured by using local law enforcement calls for service data.
- (2) Improvement in the trust relationship between the target communities and local law enforcement. Results to be measured by using attitude surveys.
- (3) Modify the community culture regarding violence. Results to be measured by using attitude surveys.
