4. Project/Program Description

This building project will help Broward College serve the aviation industry in South Florida by expanding the available space for many aviation workforce programs at Broward College's South Campus in Pembroke Pines, Florida. Broward College's Air Traffic Control program will move from an off-site location to this location, and will add 25 graduates per year. The Professional Pilot Technology program is constrained by lack of available space to conduct student instruction, and will add 100 students per year with this expansion. The aviation maintenance program will grow by 50 additional graduates per year. The professional pilot technology program and the aviation maintenance programs have wait lists because of the lack of available space, and this appropriation will eliminate those wait lists.
