### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Child sexual exploitation and human trafficking are two of the most underprosecuted and underinvestigated crimes due to lack of resources for law enforcement. The Northeast Florida INTERCEPT task force is solely dedicated to collaboration with law enforcement partners and nonprofits to prevent, investigate, and prosecute cases related to child sexual exploitation and

human trafficking—crimes involving the most vulnerable people in our communities. This one-time appropriation will provide the task force with critical operational technology and equipment that it needs to save more children and trafficking survivors.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Northeast INTERCEPT task force has a governing board that will ensure the proper expenditure of the requested funds. The fund will be used to serve the community through law enforcement's increased capability and capacity to investigate and assist with the prosecution of child sexual exploitation and human trafficking crime.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Every citizen will benefit from law enforcement's increased ability to work these crime types as any child is a potential victim and, with this funding, law enforcement will be better prepared to prevent and respond to child sexual exploitation crimes and use the allocated resources to prevent and interrupt human trafficking networks.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funds used to support law enforcement's efforts will support every citizen in Northeast Florida, particularly the counties with INTERCEPT task force representation, such as Clay, Putnam, and St. Johns County. Every citizen will benefit from the more efficient use of law enforcement resources and safer communities.

This funding will increase law enforcement's ability to investigate and prosecute child sexual exploitation and human trafficking cases. As a result of more efficient resources, law enforcement will be able to rescue more children and human trafficking survivors. In addition to the INTERCEPT task force data, each county keeps data on every investigation, arrest, indictment, and prosecution.
