14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Specifically, this project funds the expansion of FTA's pre-apprenticeship program into Pasco, Pinellas and Manatee Counties. FTA serves as a much needed path for graduating seniors who want to enter into the trades or seek an alternative to a college degree. FTA's DOE certified program is the students' first step towards a full apprenticeship program and employment. These funds will provide opportunities to graduating seniors in three counties and give them the chance to earn a living using valuable skills during a significant workforce shortage.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FTA will provide a six-month, pre-apprenticeship program offering a national curriculum for certification in both CORE and a Level 101 in their respective trade. Once completed, students will then be introduced to immediate employment where they can make a higher wage and have the opportunity to continue their full apprenticeship.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

FTA will provide directly to students an NCCER national curriculum in both CORE (introduction to the trades) and a Level 101 of their choosing (electrical, plumbing or HVAC). Students will also receive 2,000 hours of service along with their two certifications. FTA will immediately connect each student with employment opportunities in their field as well as the opportunity to continue in a full apprenticeship program thereafter. FTA will also be able to reach exponentially more potential students and families through this appropriation though recruitment in schools and educating families regarding the opportunities in the trades. FTA knows that college is not for everyone, and with the growing demand for tradesmen and women due to the aging out of current tradespeople there is a sense of urgency for our state to promote, enroll, educate and employ students.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target audience for this project is high school seniors and/or others wishing to enroll in a nine-month preapprenticeship program. This project will focus on enrolling up to 75 students in three additional counties to its current program. All students will have the opportunity upon graduation to enroll in a full apprenticeship program and be immediately employed in the trade they have studied.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The goal is to have up to 75 students throughout Pasco, Pinellas and Manatee Counties enroll, graduate both the CORE introduction to the trades and a Level 101 in electrical, plumbing or HVAC. FTA connects 100% of program graduates to immediate employment opportunities in their respective trade so they may continue their full apprenticeship program. Each student will be measured as actual apprentices through the state hired by contractors and in a state sponsored apprenticeship program such as the Associated Builders and Contractors.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Repayment of funds on a percentage basis of services not provided per trainee.
