a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds for the Elite Healthcare Academy will be invested in a top-notch training center aimed at developing highly-skilled and compassionate CNAs. This effort addresses the growing need for healthcare professionals in Florida's aging population. Selected graduates will be offered participation in a three-month, paid Home Healthcare Practicum, serving economically disadvantaged communities and gaining valuable experience for career advancement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Instructors at our CNA Academy will provide hands-on training in clinical procedures, lead interactive classroom lectures, and conduct assessments. They'll employ state-of-the-art simulation tools for skill development and offer personalized mentorship to students. Their expertise ensures graduates are well-prepared for real-world healthcare challenges.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Graduates from our CNA Academy will offer essential healthcare services such as patient bathing, feeding, and mobility assistance. They will excel in monitoring vital signs, basic wound care, and medication administration. Skilled in patient communication and emotional support, they will play a crucial role in enhancing overall patient care.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population is: 1. Jobless persons 2. Economically disadvantaged persons 3. At-risk Age Appropriate Young Adults 4. High School Students 5. University/College Students 6. 6. Unemployed and Underemployed Individuals. With approximately 65 individuals to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase economic activity and create healthcare industry job ready individuals - According to industry studies, every dollar invested in this sector can generate up to \$1.60 in local economic returns. Considering Florida's large aging population, a 10% expansion in home health long-term care services could contribute an additional \$2 billion to the state's economy next year alone. Data Collection: Gather data on the total investment in home health long-term care in Florida for a specific year. Track economic returns, such as job creation and saved hospital costs. Metrics:Economic Multiplier: Calculate the return for each dollar invested (e.g., a return of \$1.60 per dollar indicates a 1.6 multiplier). Job Creation: Count new jobs in the home health sector.
