Roots and Wings: Project UpLift (Title 1 Elementary Schools Literacy

Roots and Wings Project Uplift is a free, small-group, after-school literacy program which serves over 1000 Palm Beach County students across 13 Title I elementary schools. Having grown exponentially since it was launched in 2017, Project Uplift is designed to infuse our area's most at-risk students with the intensive, on-site, after-school reading enrichment and guidance they need from their home school's certified teachers. Elementary illiteracy is a crisis: only 53% of Florida's 3rd

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This appropriation, if funded, will allow for expanding Project Uplift into 4 additional Title I elementary schools, serving an additional 280 students across Palm Beach County (approximately 70 students per school). Project UpLift's program is designed to provide small-group, intense, after school reading enrichment to elementary students, who are reading a grade-level or more below state standards. From pre-K through 3rd grade, children must learn to read, so later they can read to learn; otherwise, they simply are doomed to fall further and further behind.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Certified teachers from the students' home schools will provide at least 54 hours of free, on-site, intensive, small group reading tutorials over a period of 18 weeks. Proven remedial reading techniques and resources are individualized to meet each student's challenges. Project UpLift also provides personal incentives to challenged readers, rewarding attendance and improvements in iReady test scores.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Project UpLift creates economic opportunity through literacy. The program serves over 1000 disadvantaged elementary school students at Title I Elementary Schools in Palm Beach County, who are reading a grade or more below grade level. The program cost to Roots and Wings is very low -- less than \$600 per student -- all of which is covered by private grants and donations. In other words, the program is provided at no charge to the participating students' families. The Project UpLift model enables teachers to address components not included in the regular school day, such as foundational phonics for students beyond 2nd grade.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Project UpLift targets disadvantaged elementary students reading a grade or more below grade level. Participants are students at local Title I schools with large numbers of under-resourced children, many from families living below the poverty level. Currently Roots and Wings serves over 1000 students in 13 schools. If funded, this appropriation will allow the program to expand to 4 additional schools and 280 more students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

With Project UpLift's program, the goal is to provide early intervention for our poorest elementary students who are reading a grade-level or more below state standards. 94% of Project Uplift students made gains on their iReady achievement goals for the 2022-23 school year, and 63% met their growth goals, despite being at least 1-2 grade levels below their peers.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables without notification of good reasoning will result in financial penalties as described in contract.
