The Palm Beach Sheriff's Office Substation Facility will construct a resilient critical public safety facility for the mid and western portion of Palm Beach County. The new structure will support the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office operations and service to the 65,000+ community on a daily basis and during disasters. The facility will be hardened to provide protection from high winds and power loss.

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Wellington received approximately \$7.2 million in ARPA funds. The first half, approximately \$3.6 million was received in May 2021 and the second half, the remaining \$3.6 million was received in June 2022. Wellington used these funds to replace lost revenues of almost \$9 million during the pandemic. These lost revenues were primarily from lost charges for services for the majority of parks and recreation programs which were closed during the pandemic. Wellington also used these revenue replacement funds for provision of government services to continue uninterrupted service levels and facility maintenance throughout the pandemic.

The revenues with the highest losses from the pandemic funded:

- 1. law enforcement,
- 2. public works,
- 3. community services,
- 4. parks and recreation, and
- 5. customer service

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will develop a resilient critical public safety facility. The new structure will allow the Palm Beach County Sheriff department to operate and serve the community of over 65,000 on a daily basis and during a disaster such as hurricane. The facility will be hardened to provide protection from high winds and power loss.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project was developed as part of a Facility needs Analysis completed by an architecture and planning firm. The report identified the needed size and resiliency characteristics to provide an effective public safety facility. The project will engage a construction contractor to construct a hardened 10,000 SF critical facility. The work will consist of constructing the hardened critical facility including installation of an emergency generator system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide a safe and hardened critical facility for law enforcement to provide emergency response directly to the community on a daily basis and during and after a disaster such as hurricane.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will provide public safety and emergency response to the entire community of over 65,000 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The direct outcome of the project will be the protection of law enforcement personnel, equipment and vehicles from the impacts of high winds and power loss. As a result of this resiliency the project will result in reliable public safety service from the PBSO during both daily operations and at times of emergency such as hurricane. The project outcomes and impact will be measured by the ability of the Sheriff personnel to protect the over 65,000 residents of the community during all conditions.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The Village anticipates the funding to be reimbursed only after the deliverables are completed, as identified in the contract. If the deliverables are not met, then funding would not be reimbursed.
