4. Project/Program Description

The Senior Kosher Meals Program at the David Posnack Jewish Community Center (DPJCC) serves a nutritious kosher lunch to area residents 60+. Meals from the grant are also served at the Daniel Cantor Senior Center + Adult Day Care/Alzheimer's Respite Program through a partnership with Meals on Wheels South FL. The program provides a pleasant atmosphere where seniors can come together for services/activities that enhance dignity, support their independence and encourage their involvement in and with their community. The LSP strives to meet the needs of the 60+ community so they can maintain an acceptable quality of life in their own homes and avoid or delay nursing home placement. The DPJCC has the facilities to promote healthy living and has specific classes designed to engage the 60+ community. Classes and the addition of part time social workers facilitate support groups and encourage social interaction which makes a big impact on meeting increasingly changing needs.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Daily meals served at the DPJCC and the Daniel Cantor Senior Center will maintain or improve the nutritional status of the elderly community who receive meals through these funds. As well, the activities at the DPJCC enhance dignity and support independence. The program strives to meet the needs of the elderly community so the participants can maintain an acceptable quality of life in their own homes and avoid or delay nursing home placement. Post Covid, this program has become an essential lifeline for older people to prevent isolation. Further, the majority of our elderly come to eat at least three times a week and benefit from the programs we run during lunch, but also just before and after.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Participants receive a nutritious Kosher meal 5 days a week (Monday through Friday) excluding holidays. During lunch, the Senior Lunch Coordinator develops a relationships with those attending, and keeps an eye on how they are doing. We offer games and entertainment during lunch itself. Puzzles are used to encourage mental stimulation and entertainment (mainly singing, or bingo) provides conversation and enjoyment. Further, we run a number of classes before and after lunch for this group. Some of these are exercise based, others are for wellness and then for enrichment. We are able to offer multiple classes per day built around the lunch program. Our staff runs activities and support for lunch across two locations and three programs (Daniel Cantor Senior Center in Sunrise with their day care center and Alzheimer's program, and the meals program at the David Posnack JCC).

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participants receive 1 Kosher nutritious meal 5 days per week (Monday through Friday excluding holidays.) They also receive group counselling services by a licensed MSW, as well as access to the enrichment and wellness classes.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Individuals 60 years of age or older, and across both sites, we serve 130 meals per day, or 650 per week.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome is that the majority of the program participants improve their nutritional status as measured by the Nutrition Score portion of the Uniform Client Assessment.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
