14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Since 1966, the PMoA has been the anchor arts and cultural destination in Polk County. No other museum provides the same breadth and depth of fine art experiences in such a large geographic area. The Museum is now at a pivotal juncture to elevate the economic impact with a major expansion to the present building, which was constructed in 1988. The addition will greatly enhance the visitor experience with six new galleries/multipurpose spaces, increasing opportunities to host exhibitions, further establishing this region as a burgeoning center for cultural experiences and economic vitality.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The PMoA expansion doubles the square footage of galleries allowing for more opportunities to showcase the growing permanent art collection and host more artists and their works through curated exhibitions with free admission to the public. A partnership with Polk County Schools will also be strengthened by increasing the number of educational programs including more guided tours, workshops and lectures for students and educators, summer art camps and learning labs, and professional development for teachers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

PMoA is admission-free, providing visitors with incomparable no-cost opportunities to experience art in fun and educational ways. The expansion enables the museum to host more exhibitions of history's most acclaimed artists, offer more exceptional free and educational programs to visitors of all ages, and elevate the national and international profile as one of the few community and academic fine arts museums in the United States.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

PMoA serves a wide population of visitors and learners of all ages and abilities (including general audiences, preschoolers, K-12 students, college students, at-risk youth, and the elderly) throughout Polk County and neighboring regions as well as from across the State. Once completed, the Museum hopes to welcome more visitors to the county, the region, and the State, while maintaining a dedication to the visitors and students served at present. After the expansion is completed, the Museum hopes to grow the overall attendance numbers from 148,000 to 200,000 annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Museum expects the completed project will yield (1) increased number of masterwork and permanent collection exhibits annually, which will help grow a national reputation; (2) higher numbers of residents of all ages visiting the PMoA including K-12 students; (3) increasing the number of out-of-county patrons who stay overnight bolstering tourism dollars for Polk County and Florida; (4) more collaborations with other arts focused community organizations. Progress will be measured toward these goals by tracking attendance through zip codes/state or country of origin in a database for annual comparison.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the project isn't completed, the Museum (PMoA) will return the funds to the State.
