14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of this project is to raise awareness of substance misuse, with a special emphasis on prescription opioid abuse. In addition, the project will address and help Florida's youth and their families to better understand the opioid overdose epidemic and to scale up prevention activities across Florida by increasing awareness of the dangers and addictive properties of opioid, including prescription medications,



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Clubs will provide programming to raise awareness of substance abuse and misuse with an emphasis on opioids. Programming will be provided weekly to the selected youth with pre- and post-test data to measure student progress. In addition, each Boys & Girls Club will provide a menu of prevention strategies for staff, youth, and families on the Organization's website.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

By implementing Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) vetted programs and/or locally developed programs early to school-age students, it is our hope that it will reduce the impact of the opioid epidemic in future generations. Florida Boys & Girls Clubs provide a safe environment, high-quality programs, and unique experiences to students from kindergarten to twelfth-grade.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

More than 5,000 school-age (kindergarten through twelfth-grade) children will receive high-quality afterschool programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is for every young person to be equipped with the knowledge, skills, behaviors, and attitudes necessary to prevent opioid and prescription drug misuse. The outcome and efficacy of the project will be determined through a third party evaluator, pre- and post-tests, questionnaires / surveys, and program attendance.
