14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improving workforce readiness and addressing mental health among underserved community members is a priority for HUF. Regularly, HUF sees clients who are underemployed and are also dealing with mental health issues. Lack of information, stigma, and scarcity of services are some challenges individuals face when dealing with mental health trauma. With support from the State of Florida, HUF will credential additional mental health workers and expand outreach efforts to South Florida residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Recruit and train 25+ individuals to become Certified Community Mental Health Workers. HUF to deliver 30 hours of training, and a minimum of 20 additional hours of training related to informal counseling, trauma informed care, group facilitation, and culturally competent care.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

HUF staff will engage citizens through outreach to provide information, case management, and referrals to adults and families related to mental wellness with a workforce development component included in the program. By addressing the stresses and traumas of an individual, success (staff retention and productivity) in the workplace is improved.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

- -Persons with poor mental health
- -Jobless persons
- -Economically disadvantaged persons
- -Grade school students
- -High school students
- -University/College students
- -At-risk youth
- -Elderly persons

Expected to serve over 800 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- -Program participants receive mental health services that increase job readiness success measured by percentage of program participants that demonstrate increased wellbeing, measured by Warwick Edinburgh Wellbeing Scale, pre- and post- evaluations.
- -Individuals earn Certified Community Health Worker trainings and credential success measured by number of persons completing Certified Community Health Worker training & receiving credential and number of persons using CCHW credential for employment (new or existing position).
- -Individuals become employed and/or gain better employment; individuals increase financial stability; create specific immediate job opportunities measured by number of persons becoming employed or improving employment (pre- and post- evaluation) and percentage of persons increasing income (pre- and post- evaluation).

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Meeting deliverables and performance measures are critical to our success and that of the community members we serve. Penalties for non-performance may include reduction in funding or inability to be reimbursed for ineligible activities that have been completed, return of funds, and/or termination of award.
