#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the project is to enable students to explore, discover, inventory, analyze, research, and interpret natural and human-made places within Florida with particular emphasis on those significant in the Civil Rights Movement of America. Exposure to historic places may be accomplished virtually and onsite.

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#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities and services will include developing teaching material that will educate students regarding people and places that came before us and to thereby foster a sense of culture related to our state. Visits to historic places will permit students to avoid mistakes and create better paths for our societies. Learning materials to be developed through this project will allow students to visit historic places virtually or onsite.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will understand the historical values of objects, respect diverse cultures, and understand a multicultural populace. They will survey architecture of a particular period and appreciate the quality of art of various generations. They may discover buried treasures which will give us insight into the economic conditions of various periods of American life

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target of the project will be Florida students who will have opportunities to visit historic places including the Moore Cultural Center, Wells'Built Museum, Zora Hurston Museum, John Riley House, Lincolnville, Jackie Robinson Stadium, Bethune Cookman University, Hampton House, Woodson Museum, Ritz Theatre, Bethel Institutional Baptist Church, Olustee Battle Field, Fernandina/Ft. Clinch, and Rosewood. Emphasis will be placed on students in grades 4 and 8.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will be measured based on the number of virtual and onsite visits made to the historic places highlighted in the request. Students will benefit by understanding the archaeological value, architectural value, communal value, historic value, and associative value of places that are real and personal. They will touch the lives of people who have many times been recorded in history.
