4. Project/Program Description

This project includes installation of pipe and drainage structures in Southwest Ranches right-of-way along SW 160th Avenue between SW 53rd Court and SW 56th Street. This mitigation project will help remove flood waters from roadways in this heavily traveled area of Southwest Ranches. Historically, during extreme rainfall events, SW 160th Avenue has experienced some of the most severe flooding within the jurisdictional limits of Southwest Ranches. In fact, the Town has been forced to close the roadway after heavy rains due to flooding.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



The project goal is to provide flood relief and improved water quality to all our constituents. This project is part of the Town's overall resiliency efforts to create a healthy community while improving water quality. This project will remove flood waters from roads in this heavily traveled area. It will provide critical drainage capacity for storm-water runoff, thereby reducing roadway flooding (both volume and duration), and the frequency of property damage and personal injury.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes installation of storm drainage piping, concrete catch basins and inlets with grates, coring of existing catch basins, grading, back-filling and street repair and repaving, installation of erosion control measures, and installation of swales and grass sodding.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will remove flood waters from roadways in the heavily traveled area of Southwest Ranches. It will provide critical drainage capacity for storm-water runoff, thereby reducing roadway flooding and the frequency of property damage and personal injury to motorists and pedestrians.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will provide flood relief to all our constituents. It is a highly traveled area just north of Hawkes Bluff Elementary School and includes major traffic arterials serving the Town of Davie, City of Weston, and City of Pembroke Pines. It serves as an emergency access route. Students that live within two miles of the school are not provided bus service. Flooded streets create hazardous conditions for these students. This area does not have sidewalks, so pedestrians are forced to walk in the center of the road if the area is flooded. There are four houses of worship, whose significant traffic is impacted by this issue.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The purpose of this project is multi-faceted, with one objective set to reduce stormwater staging in the basin and the other to significantly increase water quality. The outcomes will be measured through water quality testing and basin capacity reports.
