14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project goal is to provide flood relief and improved water quality to all our constituents. This project is part of the Town's overall resiliency efforts to create a healthy community while improving water quality. This project will remove flood waters from roads in this heavily traveled area. It will provide critical drainage capacity for storm-water runoff, thereby reducing roadway flooding (both volume and duration), and the frequency of property damage and personal injury.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes but is not limited to the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools, equipment, machinery, expertise, services, and all else necessary for proper construction and completion of the project consisting of excavation, installation of storm drainage piping, clearing and grubbing, constructing concrete catch basins and inlets with grates, headwalls, coring of existing catch basins, grading, back-filling and street repair and repaving, installation of erosion control measures, and installation of swales and grass sodding.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The mitigation improvements associated with this project will provide a series of positive drainage connections to SBDD's canals and pump stations. This improvement will provide a tremendous benefit in mitigating personal injury due to flooding. This project will significantly reduce flooding during extreme rainfall events (both stages and durations), thereby reducing the frequency of property damage and personal injury to motorists and pedestrians.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The execution of this project will provide flood relief to all of our constituents. It is a highly traveled area that serves as emergency access routes during evacuations and other emergency purposes. Students that live within two miles of the Hawkes Bluff Elementary School are not provided bus service. Flooded streets create hazardous conditions for these students. This area does not have sidewalks, so pedestrians are forced to walk in the center of the road if the area is flooded.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The purpose of this project is multi-faceted, with one objective set to reduce stormwater staging in the basin and the other to significantly increase water quality. The outcomes will be measured through water quality testing and basin capacity reports.
