4. Project/Program Description

Workforce Ready Advancement & Placement (WRAP) is an intensive job and career-readiness program, which is designed to prepare youth, ages 16-25, for their successful entry into the workforce. WRAP is a deliberate effort to ending the cycle of poverty within the youth population in economically deprived communities. In order to break the cycle of poverty, which is a known factor of youth violence in any community, there needs to be a deliberate attempt at providing for economic self-sufficiency amongst the youth population. WRAP services provide a bridge between high school and the workforce. Program participants complete a career interest inventory, then they go through a 12-week training inclusive of field trips and shadow days with potential employers. At WRAP, we don't only prepare participants for workforce success; we go a step further and place them in the best-fit job sites based on their career interests, while creating a WIN-WIN for both employers and program participant.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

WRAP Around Us Program is intentionally purposed to increase the employment rate amongst youth in age range 16-25 while producing well-trained, responsible, productive, decisive, and professional workforce leaders who are strategically groomed for advancement in the workplace and in life. To that end, our goal is to prepare program participants for long-term employment, particularly in high-demand jobs, so that they can become financially independent.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

WRAP Around Us Program services are designed to be holistic in practice with a deliberate focus on the whole person. With that in mind, some of the services will include the following:

1) A thorough Needs Assessment to determine where the candidate is in life with respect to their readiness for performance and functionality in the workplace,

2) Completion of an intensive 3-month workforce readiness program, followed by job placement,

3) Participation in a WRAP Job Symposium & Fair (2 per year),

4) Assigned to a Career Success Coach to provide continuous support, workforce placement and advancement coaching services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

WRAP Around Us Program is intentionally designed to prepare, engage and empower youth ages 16-25 for their successful transition into the workforce, thus increasing their participation in the workplace and preventing them from dropping out of life. Through this funding, we intend to serve 100 youth in Miami-Dade and Broward Counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?



WRAP Around Us Program offers youth valuable and transferrable skills that will prepare them for long-term employment, particularly in high-demand jobs that are quite often hard to fill. For some, this will be an opportunity to contribute to their family household income, thus reducing homelessness, food insecurity and crime reduction in the age group 16-25. Our outcomes will be measured using a needs assessment upon enrollment; career interest survey; attendance record (participants cannot have no more than 2 excused absences); administration of pre and post-tests to gauge learning gains; program completion; job placement and job retention (3, 6, 9 and 12 months upon placement).

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties

for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures agreed upon contract negotiation should be met with the following penalties:

1) Written report highlighting areas of immediate need for improvement, followed by corrective action plan to be submitted within 30 days of receipt.

2) Continued failure should follow by withheld of funds until all action plans are met with satisfaction.

3) Repeat failure of same infractions should be met with contract suspension.
