### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Medical Laboratory Technology has been identified as program of strategic emphasis, and CareerSource Central Florida projects a job growth rate for this field of over 15% through 2030. The need for this program has been confirmed by healthcare partners. The project will also increase access to a microbiology lab for prerequisites. This remodel would include new building infrastructure necessary for lab work and specialized furniture, fixtures and equipment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This lab will support increased capacity of Seminole State's allied health programs, including nursing, thereby helping to fill critical gaps in regional and statewide workforce needs, particularly nursing and allied health fields. By producing graduates to meet workforce needs in healthcare and increasing the number of providers, citizens will gain better access to quality and affordable health care.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Construction will provide new jobs and supports regional economic development. The new lab will be used for training citizens for high-demand, high-skill, high-wage jobs in healthcare and other STEM occupations. According to Career Source Central Florida data, the mean hourly wage in these occupations range from \$28.88 to \$63.19 per hour. With the new building, we expect to double the number of students we serve on this campus (-4,500to ~9,000). The project also increases access to healthcare services through increased workforce.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Citizens and students seeking training and/or credentials for high-demand, high-skill and high-wage employment. We expect to serve at least 50-100 people per year in these programs through this facility.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This new lab space will help create a new med / tech program and provide a microbiology lab at the Altamonte campus. Current students must travel to the main campus to use such a lab. This will in turn increase regional access to healthcare service due to increases in skilled providers.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Seminole State College has standard performance clauses in all of its contracts which ensure that work will be completed in accordance with the work plan, time frame, and list of deliverables, including provisions relating to the payment and withholding of funds as necessary. It is not anticipated that additional penalties will be needed. Deliverables will include the total remodeling of this unused automotive dealership building.
