a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

We will launch a library/online channel of 10 educational videos and 100+ short videos that teach life skills, increase self-esteem, stop negative behaviors, and focus on academic resilience. These on-demand videos will allow us to broaden our reach from South Florida to the entire state. By preparing girls in grades 9-12 for higher education and ultimately the workforce, we are developing pathways out of poverty to ensure future economic success for both them and the state.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A series of 10 educational videos on a variety of relevant topics will be hosted in a video library/channel that will allow girls in public high schools from grades 9-12 to watch on-demand. We will utilize social media to highlight the videos to increase engagement from this cohort.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Creation of a video library with curated content developed specifically to meet the interest and needs of at-risk young women in grades 6-12 as they navigate challenges, achieve academic success, prepare for college and the workforce, and discover career paths and opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population for this project is at-risk girls in grades 9-12 throughout the entire State of Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits include improved quality of education, improved physical and mental health, enriched cultural experiences, and protection from harm, physical dangers, diversion from criminal and juvenile justice system.
