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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

We hope that a cyber-education program will help thrust Florida into the forefront as a "forward thinking" hub for emerging technologies. With cyber-certified talent, we can attract these companies. Also, cyber-security specialties can help combat the proliferation of human trafficking across the state as many of the supporting activities (like identity theft) of these activities occurs online. The establishment of a cyber-secure, cyber-educated young populace can help both those points. Technology is one of the top sectors of projected job growth. According to a report by (ISC)2 in 2021, the number of unfilled cybersecurity positions stands at 4.07 million, up from 2.93 million in 2020. As a result of poor education and lack of focus on cyber-security, there is now a 1.8 million person headcount gap. Additionally, Florida is ranked #3 in human trafficking. As the world continues to transform digitally, internet technologies are increasingly being used by traffickers.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

We will recruit students from the 6th to the 12th grades and introduce them to human trafficking, cyber safety & cybersecurity through a 8-week certificate courses. This will include critical human trafficking awareness and education to protect youth in our communities, cyberbullying, building resilient emotional digital firewalls, and much more. Each week, special guest speakers share of their experience and knowledge in various sectors of cyber safety & cybersecurity, in addition to Q&A for youth interested in pursuing a career in the cybersecurity sector.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Educational services will be provided to the citizens by this appropriation project. We will support Grade 6-12 youth & families through human trafficking awareness, cyber safety & cyberbullying education, and becoming lifelong digital citizens. This program will educate young persons and may help us garner national attention for our focus on the 1.8 million personnel gap in cybersecurity. Additionally, a focus on trafficking and the impact of the internet/technology, we will be part of the solution in protecting youth from dangerous predators online.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target audience is Florida students in 6th grade - 12th grade. We will focus locally in Broward and expect 100-125 participants. Target populations include economically disadvantaged, at-risk youth, grade school students, high school students, current or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice), and victims of crime.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve mental health, enrich cultural experience, improve quality of education, protect the general public from criminal harm, enhance specific individual's economic self sufficiency, create specific immediate job opportunities, and divert from Criminal/Juvenile Justice System. The outcomes will be measured by database tracking, life Skills Assessment/goal objectives and/or Activity/Teaching Log, weekly quizzes, along with pre and post program surveys.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

We will strive to meet all deliverable and performance measures, with a suggested penalty of full program shut-down, should we fail to meet as per the contract.
