Direct services include improved well-being, psychological and social health for residents through exposure to nature. Improvements will enable and encourage citizens to exercise, improve the overall health of the community, foster social connections and play a vital role in increasing available sports and community-based programs and for all ages.

General public. The park serves over 175,000 residents of Palm Beach and Martin Counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Improvements to our recreational fields, courts and nature trails will enable and encourage citizens to exercise. Exposure to natural environments and increased physical activity has been shown to decrease anxiety and improve mental health. The park will promote outdoor activities for people of all ages. Parks provide a safe place for kids when they are not in school and create a space for community members to congregate safely and enjoy nature. Measured by Health Department Statistics and State Comprehensive Outdoor Recreational Plan. The improvements made to the regional park will provide jobs during planning and construction. Parks are also a source of positive economic benefits, enhance property values, increase municipal revenue and attract home buyers. Measured by tracking park users, events and related revenues.
