4. Project/Program Description

State appropriations would be allocated towards revitalization improvements to the City's central park, which houses the City's community center and abuts the historical and majority African American neighborhood of East Stuart. These enhancements include a new multi-purpose field for variety recreation and play activities, restrooms, children's play area, fitness loop, pavilions, and stormwater and irrigation infrastructure enhancements. Guy Davis Park also serves a nearby school (JD Parker Elementary) with a local area that is historically blighted and includes undeserved persons who will benefit from the park improvements. Revitalizing the City's central park, which lies in the heart of the Stuart Community Redevelopment Area (CRA) will provide critical facilities and recreational services that have been more than two-decades in the making.

The City of Stuart (to date) received \$8,132,360 from the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds as part of the American Rescue Plan Act. Funds have been used to offset dollars spent on emergency response and overtime for personnel, Alternative Water Supply infrastructure, water/sewer infrastructure, law enforcement response to violent crimes and gun violence, community nonprofit support, dispatch and police officer equipment, streetscape improvements, and stormwater projects.

The City of Stuart is the owner of the facility and the entity. Fixed capital outlay for the local match will come from a combination of CRA (TIF funds) revenue and the levying of a bond. The park is a central hub for the city, which will likely serve both the adjoining neighborhood and the community at large.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

State appropriations would be allocated towards revitalization improvements to the City's central park, which houses the City's community center and abuts the historical and majority African American neighborhood of East Stuart. b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Although appropriated funds will be used for capital outlay, the resulting revitalized park and amenities will afford area residents and the larger community a central gathering space for programs and activities. These activities will also reach a community in a neighborhood area with at-risk youth, economically disadvantaged persons, elderly, and persons with disability or impairment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Activities will include recreational and educational programs, a healthy [walking] trail, new parking and bathroom facilities, and beautification enhancements to improve a previously blighted area. It is also important to note the park improvements will primarily start with critical stormwater infrastructure installation to retain and treat water on site and protect surrounding homes.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The City contains a population of more than 17,000 persons, however, Stuart is a centralized commercial hub for Martin County and southern Port. St. Lucie. As a result, statistical data from the City's downtown parks show a substantial visitation from both tourists and members of the larger community outside city jurisdiction. Moreover, the park has been designed with regional and national tourism in-mind, with a multi-purpose field that can serve as a host for tournament play.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Primarily, the new facilities included in the park will provide a totally new recreational, cultural, and family-oriented experience for thousands of visitors everyday. The existing (30-acre) park site is largely unimproved and is inadequate for the existing (and future) demand. The growth of recreational programs and scheduling of new facilities will be tracked by the City's recreational department, who is tasked with coordinating and managing all use of park amenities.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties

for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Penalty for failure to meet deliverables or performance measures would be withholding of funding until grant administration is reconciled with desired objectives. The City has a long and successful history collaborating and cooperating with FDEP on various grant-awarded projects.
