b. Organization

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Deliverables will be measured based on:

- Number of digital tool certifications earned by elementary and middle school students.
- The number of industry certifications attained by middle and high school students.
- The number of students who access the innovation center.
- The number of students who enroll in the different programs offered after school, on the weekends, and in the summer.
- The increase in middle and high school career and technical education course enrollment during the school day based on their exposure to CTE in elementary school.
- The number of partner programs we make available to community stakeholders such as parents and caregivers.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Santa Rosa Center for Innovation will not compete with existing projects or programs but will enhance those within our region by providing a space that will serve as the Career and Technical Education and STEAM hub for our region. The intent is to have a place-based learning center where students, parents, and community members are vested. The impact of the Center is transformational in that it will serve as a place for education, community, and business and industry to collaborate for the purpose of Workforce Development. Additionally, it provides an opportunity for business and industry to directly engage with their future workforce and educators contributing to program development and students' technical skill attainment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Santa Rosa County District Schools

The Santa Rosa Center for Innovation is transformational in multiple ways bringing about positive changes across the school district and community. The Center will expand opportunities for students in CTE and STEAM to afterschool, evenings, weekends, and summers. This collaborative space for education and business and industry will help to enhance workforce development and community engagement initiatives, not only in Santa Rosa County, but across Northwest Florida. Our project directly aligns with the Northwest Florida FORWARD initiative for regional economic growth and development. In addition to the primary education objectives of this project it will also focus on digital literacy and provision of health related services to the citizens of Santa Rosa County.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Santa Rosa Center for Innovation aims to serve elementary, middle and high school students within our community as well as their families. It is the goal of our project to serve 300-400 students, teachers and community stakeholders the first year and to increase the participation by at least 30% each year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Santa Rosa Center for Innovation project provides clear quantitative measures which include digital tool certification attainment, industry certification attainment, enrollment at the center, and increased CTE course and program enrollment throughout the district over a multi year period. We anticipate our participants will attain approximately 10,000 industry recognized credentials over the next decade.
