

1. Project Title WSRE Antenna Removal in Escambia County for Pensacola State College

4. Project/Program Description

WSRE is a Public Broadcast Station for Escambia & Santa Rosa Counties. In 1967, the current antenna was erected on county property at the edge of development to broadcast to the community. Over the last 55 years, development has grown around the tower and it was utilized by the county as well as commercial users. However, when new windloads were adopted 222 (g), the current antenna could not meet the new requirements and could not be altered to do so either. As a result, both WSRE and Escambia County have removed and relocated all their infrastructure off the antenna. Just this year the final commercial user leases have ended, and they have removed as well. Now the antenna stands simply as a liability to 3 surrounding public buildings, the Escambia County Sheriff's Office, the Escambia County main bus station and the Department of Health Escambia office. The funding request is to remove the antenna before it causes damage and to do so without impacting funds to educate citizens.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The removal of the antenna will remove the liability to Pensacola State College and the State of Florida should the outdated antenna fall. The funds requested would also enable the education of NW Floridians by the college to not be impacted.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A specialized contractor, due to the surrounding structures and on going public services administration in the shadow of the antenna, will use the funds to expertly remove the antenna with no impact to the buildings or public. Please note that both Escambia County and the Escambia County Sheriff's Office have buildings that could be damaged if the antenna were to fall. Both Escambia County and the Escambia County Sheriff have provided support letters for the funding of this project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The potential liability will be removed and there will be no adverse impact on the funds used to educate the citizens of Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties by Pensacola State College.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Since its erection, the antenna has served the two county service area of Pensacola State College which is Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties, with a current population of nearly 500,000. All of those citizens could potentially be served by Pensacola State College and WSRE.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The liability from the outdated antenna to the people of Escambia County and the State of Florida will be removed with the removal of the antenna. This will be measured by the removal of the antenna. With it gone, there will be no liability.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The funding will not be expended if the antenna is not removed so the entire request is totally performance based. The college and its vendor will have all the incentive to timely complete the project if funding is provided.
