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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Florida's Boys & Girls Clubs give young people hope and provide them with the opportunities and resources necessary to engage in positive alternatives to gang participation and involvement. The goal of this program is to help young people learn about and avoid some of the most immediate threats to their well-being. The program is evidence-based and uses a curriculum with measurable impacts and the focus areas of positive peer interactions; resiliency training; problem solving; decision making; and gang awareness.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Through the national organization the Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA), Clubs will provide the SMART (Skills Mastery and Resilience Training) Moves suite of prevention and education programs weekly to students from kindergarten to twelfth grade, focusing on positive peer interactions; resiliency; problem solving; decision making; and gang involvement prevention.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Afterschool programs are uniquely positioned to help adolescents avoid negative risk behaviors such as substance use, unsafe sexual behaviors, and fighting and bullying by providing a place to go where youth can feel safe, connecting them with adults they can trust, focusing their attention on positive challenges and encouraging them to make good choices by engaging in meaningful activities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida at-risk youth in grades kindergarten through twelfth-grade attending the Boys & Girls Clubs during out of school time; their families; and the surrounding communities. The program will provide at least 277,000 filled program slots.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is to engage youth within their communities, schools, organizations, peer groups, and families in a manner that is productive and constructive; recognizes, utilizes, and enhances young people's strengths; and promotes positive outcomes for young people by providing opportunities, fostering positive relationships, and furnishing the support needed to build on their leadership strengths. The outcome will be measured through the youth's data collected by the local Boys & Girls Clubs, national data, and the analysis from the Clubs' third-party evaluator.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

A complete Corrective Action Plan set by the Department of Juvenile Justice and a reduction of funds.
