#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Food Bank will partner with the Child Care Food Program (Afterschool meals, Summer BreakSpot meals, child care centers as well as low income senior centers) and home delivered meals providers to cater upwards of 10,000 meals a day.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used for the purchase of equipment and final construction projects including doors and other barriers to ensure that the Community Kitchen can adequately operate for job-training culinary classes and production of prepared food for community providers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Using a community kitchen to prepare meals for the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) in Palm Beach County, Florida can be a mutually beneficial arrangement. Community kitchens have the capacity to produce large quantities of high-quality meals, while CACFP providers need access to nutritious meals that meet USDA requirements.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Youth, seniors and other at-risk individuals. At full capacity, the Community Kitchen is expected to be able to produce 10,000 meals per day.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased access to nutritious meals for children and adults in Palm Beach County. A commercial kitchen would allow the CACFP program to produce more meals and reach more people in need. Increased access to nutritious meals for children and adults in Palm Beach County.
