The Regional Entrepreneurship Centers and Statewide Small Business Loan Fund provide technical assistance, business management training, direct lending, access to market through partnership development and ecosystem cultivation access to capital and other services to small businesses particularly minority and women owned, in metropolitan areas of Broward, Dade, Palm Beach, Duval, Clay, Nassau, St. Johns, Baker, Flagler, Putnam, Volusia and Pinellas Counties in the State of Florida. Urban League of Broward and its subsidiary the Central County Community Development Corporation, a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) will leverage raised capital with The Department of Economic Opportunity's investment and the established DEO guarantee fund.

#### 14. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Regional Entrepreneurship Centers and Statewide Small Business Loan Fund provide business management training, lending solutions, and other services to minority-owned small businesses. This program also provides technical assistance and access to capital via a revolving loan fund for growing and expanding businesses, particularly minority-owned and women-owned throughout Florida. The goal of the Small Business Loan Fund is to create additional capital to sustain and grow existing viable minority owned small businesses that create jobs for community residents and build community wealth. The Urban League seeks a contract to allow for the reinvestment of the dollars to establish a revolving loan fund in perpetuity.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This request supports programming in the counties and surrounding communities of Broward, Dade, Palm Beach, Duval, Clay, Nassau, St. Johns, Baker, Flagler, Putnam, and Volusia and Pinellas counties. The major components of this request are 1) Regional Entrepreneurship Centers (ECs) which provide opportunities for small business owners and entrepreneurs to gain access to market prospects, technical support and capital to improve and grow their businesses. 2) Statewide Small Business Loan Fund: Urban League of Broward County's Community Development Financial Institution, Central County Community Development Corporation, administers the Small Business Loan Fund for lending throughout the state to small businesses, in particular minority-owned small businesses, who have difficulty accessing funding from mainstream markets.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Entrepreneurship Centers (EC) provide marketing, outreach, business assessment, trainings, individualized business counseling, while leveraging local and regional resources to create access to market for businesses through partnership and ecosystem development. The Statewide Small Business Loan Fund provides direct access to capital through pre/post loan counseling, direct lending, origination and underwriting for small businesses.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funds will serve minority-owned and women-owned small businesses to provide capital and deliver technical assistance and education to qualifying small businesses. If fully funded, this program expects to serve over 2500 residents across the state, including the following counties: Broward, Palm Beach, Dade, Duval, Clay, Nassau, St. Johns, Baker, Flagler, Putnam, Volusia and Pinellas Counties and their surrounding areas.
