### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The ICPC North America Championship (NAC) brings attention to the US 3,000+ Computing students (including UF, FSU, USF, FIU, UCF) from over 400 US universities that compete annually to attend ICPC World Finals. This funding will keep the NAC in Florida where students are encouraged to join the Florida workforce (NCS) and attend Florida universities where there is a significant shortage in computing talent.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The best teams from the NAC will advance to the ICPC World Finals to compete against the best teams from over 100 countries around the world. Further, virtual and onsite career fairs are held as a part of the competition in Florida to connect the +3,000 student competitors with companies in Florida to offer internships and jobs to computing talent.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Part of the ICPC competition, the North America Programming Camp (NAPC) is a training camp guided by top trainers open to any Level-A or aspiring Level-A programming student competition teams in North America. The NAPC provides intensive training for top-level talent to prepare them to succeed at the ICPC NAC and World Finals.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

High school seniors, college and university students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Over 3,000 students at 400 universities in the US compete in ICPC Regional contests. These contests foster creativity, teamwork, and innovation in building new software programs while performing under pressure. Most importantly, the competition produces leaders in artificial intelligence and cybersecurity who create the digital world's essential fabric. Outcomes: increased talent pipeline; increase talent supply in high-wage, high-demand careers; increased protection from cyber threats due the increased availability of a highly skilled workforce; sales tax, hotel bed tax, restaurants, road tolls, and other positive state and local revenue impacts - increase by the participants, their coaches, their families, sponsors, industry and others who attend the week-long events that make up the North America Championship.
