14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This program is dedicated to bolstering the competitiveness of our local manufacturers by growing the pool of skilled labor in our county. Through collaborative efforts with our industry leaders, we will identify the skills necessary for available positions and coordinate training opportunities for our local talent pool. This initiative will also result in expanded access to high-paying, high-tech careers for our citizens, with a special emphasis on supporting veterans, military families, as well as underemployed and unemployed individuals.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to provide skills-based training, match individuals skills with job opportunities, promote manufacturing jobs, talent attraction, and assisting local manufacturers with developing apprenticeship programs.

These activities and services aim to strengthen the local workforce, increase employment in the manufacturing sector, and support community economic growth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will offer citizens direct services such as certification scholarships to enhance their qualifications and assistance specifically designed to support veterans in transitioning to civilian careers. These services are geared towards empowering individuals, enabling them to secure employment and advance their careers, ultimately promoting economic stability within the community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project is designed to serve a diverse target population, including the unemployed, under-employed, veterans, exoffenders, individuals in career transition or seeking career enhancement, non-college-bound youth, GED students, and incumbent manufacturing workers. It aims to provide a minimum of 70 individuals with scholarships that give access to skills-based training, which will pave the way for career advancement opportunities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project's goal is to establish a talent pipeline that not only meets the demands of the local industry but also facilitates career advancement for the target population, enabling them to excel in a high-wage, high-tech sector.

Quarterly reports on the number of individuals served and details about outreach efforts. This monitoring will enable ongoing assessment and adaptation of strategies to ensure the project's success in meeting both industry demands and individual career goals.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The appropriation will be a cost reimbursement grant in which the penalty for non performance would be no payment.
