14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The David Posnack Jewish Community Center has a dedicated Holocaust Learning Center. Re-opened in 2022, 2400 children, teens and adults attended an educational session in its first year. This funding will allow the Center to enhance its technology, support more schools and inter-faith groups, and increase the number of innovative educational programs available to people from all backgrounds across Broward, Miami-Dade, and Palm Beach Counties.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will go towards teachers and subject matter experts to increase number of school visits for grades 5-12, adult group education tours, and inter-faith sessions. Funding will also be applied for technology enhancements in the Center, extending how many people can be served. It will be used for new curriculum development with a focus on Florida's role in supporting Holocaust survivors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Last year, 2400 children and adults attended a learning session at the Holocaust Learning Center. With this funding, more than 3600 members of the public can be served. Funding will also go towards new learning module development, exhibitions, and enhanced educational provision.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is school age children, grades 5-12, collegiate students, adults and interfaith groups. This target population will also include developmentally disabled and physically disabled individuals as well. With this funding, we expect to serve more than 3600 members of the public (an increase of over 1200).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Holocaust Learning Center at the David Posnack JCC educates visitors about the Holocaust and its relevance to today. The Center uses pre- and post-session surveys to measure learning outcomes and gather feedback from teachers and instructors to improve its programs. The Center's programs supplement the State's mandated curriculum for Holocaust education and are tailored to the specific needs of each group. It incorporates current and local events into its programs to help visitors and students connect the past to the present. Participants undergo a pre and post learning survey, in order to capture distance traveled in terms of new knowledge gained as a result of attending a learning session or tour.
