We are seeking to create a Broward School District Police Department that will ultimately (3 year timeline) provide school police officers for every District Managed school.

Phase one: Jan 2024 through June 2024, recruitment, screening, processing, training, and outfitting 66 school police officers.

Phase two: July 2024 through June 2025, continue recruitment, screening, processing, training, and outfitting up to 100 additional school police officers.

Estimated cost for Phase one is \$5,000,000. Estimated cost for Phase two is \$6,940,000.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

We are seeking to create a School Police Department that will provide consistent, capable service to our schools and proactively help our students stay on task, stay in school, and have a safe and nurturing educational environment. This funding will give our officers the necessary tools to do an effective job.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

School police officers will receive approximately 300 hours of training tailored to school based policing.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Trainings listed above would include counseling, mentoring, indoctrination to the differences between traditional road patrol and school policing, understanding the best practices for interaction with students who have intellectual or developmental disabilities, Crisis intervention, Behavioral Threat Assessment, Incident Command System, National Incident Management System, Sports and Special Events Incident Management Plans, review of all possible alternatives to arrest that exist in Broward County, introduction to proactive programs such as G.R.E.A.T., Bullying curriculum for 3rd, 6th, 7th and 8th graders, de-escalation skills, less-lethal weapons, defensive tactics, firearms, etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately 200,000 students, families of students, faculty, and staff.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Consistent provision of Police services in our schools and a safe school environment. Pre and post school student/staff surveys, proactive programs implemented.
