4. Project/Program Description

Studies have shown that as many as 50% of individuals with intellectual disabilities (ID) and developmental disabilities (DD) have a co-occurring mental health condition, including major depression, anxiety, bi-polar disorder, psychotic disorders, impulse disorders, and others. When appropriately diagnosed and treated for their mental health conditions, persons with ID/DD can improve their level of functioning and their overall quality of life. Funding will allow Alpert JFS and The Arc of Palm Beach County (PBC) to collaborate to address the behavioral health needs of individuals with intellectual & developmental disabilities (ID/DD). The increased funding will also enable Alpert JFS to provide subsidies for the Day Socialization program at the Alpert JFS Center for Belonging & Wellbeing and partial scholarships to approximately 6 +/- families for the supported living apartment program for persons with disabilities.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding will allow Alpert JFS and The Arc of PBC to collaboratively address the behavioral health needs of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ID/DD); filling a service gap that is too often not served. The specific goal will be to create a seamless process by which clientele of The Arc of PBC are identified and psychological and psychiatric services provided through Alpert Jewish Family Service and allow The Arc to provide Psyco-Social Rehab (PSR) services post-assessment. The increased funding will also allow Alpert JFS to provide subsidies for the Day Socialization program for persons with disabilities at the Alpert JFS Center for Belonging and Wellbeing and partial scholarships to 6 +/- families for the supported living apartment program for persons with disabilities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Two licensed Alpert JFS therapists will provide mental health services for middle and high school participatns of The Arc of and their families. Alpert JFS will provide psychological evaluations to children and adults, which are a prerequisite for The Arc of PBC to be able to provide Medicaid Psyco-Social Rehab (PSR) services to adults post-assessment. In addition, subsidies for the Alpert JFS Day Socialization program & partial scholarships for supported living apartment program for persons with disabilities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Arc PBC serves individuals diagnosed with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ID/DD). Alpert JFS will provide individual psychotherapy & behavioral support services, as well as psychological testing services to clients served by the The Arc PBC. Alpert JFS will provide subsidies to the Day Socialization program for adults with disabilities and mental illness.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Arc PBC serves individuals diagnosed with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ID/DD). Alpert JFS serves adults with disabilities and mental illness. provide subsidies to the Day Socialization program for adults with disabilities and mental illness. Alpert JFS will be provide individual psychotherapy and behavioral support services, as well as psychological testing services to approximately 100 clients served by The Arc of PBC and subsidies to another approximately 20 adults with disabilities and mental illness.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

As part of our extensive Performance Quality Improvement program, all recipients of our behavioral health services will be administered the PHQ-9 and the GAD-7, used for assessing depression and anxiety. Additional measure specific to the ID/DD population will be identified, including measures of functionality and quality of life. When mental health needs of the DD/ID and mental illness population are appropriately met, it is likely that improvement in level of functioning will follow. To measure this, specific assessment of Daily Activities will be conducted, as well as a functional assessment and Life Satisfaction evaluation. Additionally, family input will be solicited when appropriate.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If we fail to deliver services as described in the contract with DCF, we will negotiate return of funds.
