14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding will be used to serve students Pre-K-12, with quality after-school and day camp programming in the underresourced/under-served community in Miami-Dade County, Florida focusing on Holistic Engagement and Enrichment. Our goal is to support the development of all children who will become academically engaged, physically fit, socially adept, and culturally enriched and to mature into independent and successful citizens for the future. Fit Kids utilizes evidence-based strategies-curricula-enrichment programs; which include: Academic Success-Homework Assistance, FAB 5 & SPARK-SPORTS, LEGO-VEX (STEM), Meet the Masters & Arts-In-Action-Arts and Culture which align with state-academic-standards to provide daily homework assistance, literacy, differentiated learning instruction (DLI), fitnessteam sports, social-emotional learning, snacks-supper. Children also receive instruction and experience a variety of enrichment activities such as field trips.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

1. Provide comprehensive programming to K-5 students with a focus on Arts & Culture (theatre), STEM (technology, mathematics) and Sports for after-school and summer camp programming.

2. Provide comprehensive programming to 6th-8th grade students with a focus on STEM (technology, engineering) and Sports for summer camp programming.

3. Provide academic programs that support school day learning. (Homework assistance, tutoring, differentiated literacy instruction, social-emotional learning and wellness, basic health and wellness). Nutrition Education, Snacks & Meals will be provided.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

1. Visual Arts will help students develop positive attitudes towards other cultures and build self-esteem and pride. They will produce numerous multi-media creations for which an art background is not necessary because all lesson plans are scripted and illustrated.

2. Students will learn STEM through Game Design, which is as inherent to student learning as reading, writing, mathematics, and other core subjects. Game Design concepts can be integrated as early as Kindergarten and carry students through 12th grade in a planned pathway to prepare them for future success. 6-8th grade students will also build robots. FK is preparing students for future success in a STEM field.

3. Students will experience improved life skills and character development through Sports activities designed to fit the needs of all the students FK serves.

4. Financial assistance and support for the parents and families of all the children in our program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Fit Kids of America "K-12 Focused on Holistic Engagement and Enrichment" program proposes to serve 255 (K-5) Participants through After-School, Summer program Participants, 315 (K-5), 60 (6-8) Graders, 23% Children with Disabilities (CWD). Our program is fully inclusive and serves children of all abilities. SEW and REDI are woven throughout all curricula and activities that are provided for participants. FK serves a predominant number of first-generation American families. English is not the primary language spoken in the home, and over 95% of the population is Hispanic, with an obesity prevalence of 48.7%, at risk and vulnerable. Ten of twelve of the partner schools are Title I schools with enrollment of over 90% of students coming from socio-economically disadvantaged homes on the Free/Reduced lunch program.
