### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Responsible Fatherhood program aims to enhance fathers' participation in their children's lives through workshops, mentorship, and support groups. The aims to decrease delinquency and lower the risk of children entering the criminal justice system & enhance education. Research has shown that children from single-parent households are more likely to be involved in the criminal justice system, as per "Fragile Families and Child Wellbeing Study" (FFCWS) by Princeton and Columbia Universities.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The specific activities and services to be provided with these funds include: developing and implementing educational/vocational programs, Father 2 Father mentorship program, Trauma Informed Therapeutic Services, Home Environment Stabilization, Improved Student Grades, Behavior & Attendance & Increased Father / Child engagement.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Parenting Education, Co-Parenting Support, Financial Management, Employment Assistance, Health & Wellness, Social & Emotional Support services, to provide fathers with the support needed to be successful.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is single-parent families, young fathers, single-parent fathers, nuclear families, economically disadvantage families & fathers, at-risk youth and young adults, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, military veterans and divorcees. Total # of individuals to be served is approximately 175.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Children - Increased Economic Stability:

1. Enhanced employment and economic stability of fathers, benefiting families and contributing to the economic vitality of the counties.
