Tuition scholarships will help alleviate the cost of a college education and reduce the burden on young Floridians with learning and attention issues.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Tuition scholarship assistance will be provided to young Floridians with learning and attention issues.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Tuition assistance provided to high-need Florida students with learning and attention issues will broaden our workforce to include more citizens with learning and attention issues, a population that faces significant unemployment. Beacon is heralded as the top school in the nation for educating students with learning and attention issues and learning disabilities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Beacon's Florida students -- all, of which, have learning and attention issues -- will be eligible to be served and supported. There are approximately 70-100 students targeted.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Florida students with learning and attention issues will be able to enroll in an academic community that has been heralded as one of the top institutions of higher education for students with learning and attention issues and learning disabilities. Tuition scholarships will make the pursuit of a college education more affordable. Beacon graduates 63% of this population of student while, nationally, less than 30% of students with learning and attention issues graduate.

Beacon will provide the contracting agency with a complete breakdown of students who are provided tuition assistance.
