14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The implementation of Walkabouts programming in Florida elementary schools will help reach the following goals: 1) getting students to move more during the school day, thereby increasing blood flow to the brain 2) helping students reach higher levels of fitness 3) increasing attention spans 4) decreasing negative behaviors 5) increasing academic performance and 6) allowing teachers to more easily and effectively evaluate in real time which students need more practice on a specific academic skill. These goals have been achieved by the use of Walkabouts in over 14 other states.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The kinesthetic lessons are built into the Walkabouts programming and are aligned to Florida curriculum and standards. Each lesson, even on the same subject matter, involves different types of movement. Walkabouts programing exists in the cloud; thus, there is no need for teachers to download anything to access it. If the teacher has an email, he or she can use the program. The Walkabouts team, through its parent company, Activ-Ed, provides any assistance requested for training purposes, evaluation of student performance, and ability to generate reports. This easy-to-implement process and program will immediately begin to work to effectuate the goals described above.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Walkabouts programming provides an exceptional opportunity to teachers, districts, and the state by giving them all the opportunity to employ methods that get students up and moving, thereby increasing the students' ability to grasp essential academic skills as well as reap all the benefits that directed movement provides. Parents or guardians of students who use Walkabouts will also be served by being able to have their children access the Walkabout lessons from home. This access will help parents and guardians understand the skills being taught in class and where their child can improve. Teachers will also be served by the ease of access and implementation of the program as well as by the improved behavior, academic skill, and attention of their students.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by this program is elementary aged students from grades PreK through 5. The amount requested by this project would serve 1.25 million students. Additionally, the programming will benefit hundreds of teachers' administrators, and parents/guardians.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits and outcomes from this project for students are 1) increased academic performance, 2) decreased negative classroom behaviors, and 3) increased fitness levels. These outcomes are closely monitored by Activ-Ed and Walkabouts and through Walkabouts team evaluations and the evaluation and report tools built into the programming, which can be accessed directly by teachers, administrators, school districts, and the state at any time. Additionally, peer-reviewed studies have shown that these stated outcomes are actual results that have come from the implementation of Walkabouts programming. Copies of those studies are attached to this request form.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Based upon success in other states, we fully expect grades to improve. However, we are willing to work with the Department on its suggestions on penalties for failure to meet deliverables or performance measures.
