	Horizon Communities would like to expand from their current 7 institutions to 9 institutions. This would include teaching REEFS, Quest, and computer labs in each facility. One of the facilities is an institution wide program, placing Horizon in every dorm. The funding used would provide for office space for Horizon employees, computers for the labs, books and materials, and monetary compensation for employees. Courses will be taught to more than 3,000 incarcerated men and women. A re-entry facility has been obtained to provide housing and employment to graduates of the Horizon program, that are released from the Department of Corrections, to include those with life sentences on parole. Funds would also go to resourcing this facility.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Faith and Character based curriculum and life skills training will be taught to over 3000 incarcerated men and women, preparing them to live responsibly with others. Creating a safer prison environment for security staff and the incarcerated, while promoting public safety. The support of a reentry facility that will provide housing for those released from the Department of Corrections custody.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Dorms are transformed into communities that learn how to behave in socially acceptable ways, improving behavior and promoting public safety. Providing housing and employment for returning citizens out of incarceration, to include those paroled from life sentences.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Programs offered through Horizon Communities are Quest, REEFS, and Computer Labs. Also, Conscious Discipline, victim impact, and restorative justice principles have shown the outcome of restoring self-esteem, responsibility and productivity to inmates while they are incarcerated and once, they are released. This serves not only the inmate but also the citizens in the community to which they re-enter.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Incarcerated men and women are served by this project. More than 3000 men and women are expected to be served during this fiscal year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Horizon dorms have helped prisons to be safer for both security staff and the inmates housed there. Disciplinary Reports, contraband, and assaults are recorded by the Department of Corrections. These incidents have been reduced every time Horizon has entered a prison and it is believed that this will continue. Also, recidivism rates are measured, and Horizon has a recidivism rate of 5.4% after 23 years of operation. The reentry facility will provide funds to help future ventures by Horizon in an effort to relieve the burden of state funds.
