b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The Y is committed to serving families by fostering a positive learning experience that allows children to thrive and families to have access to quality-affordable care and programs. The Y's goal is to educate children, so they become confident, socially responsible and prepared to excel in their futures from kindergarten into adulthood.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include childcare, educational instruction, food program, enrichment activities, scholarships assistance, family engagement, and so much more.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

YMCA of Southwest Florida's Early Learning program serves early learning six weeks to five years old.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Positive outcomes include students (90%) meeting or exceeding expectation in literacy and math as well as developmental milestones including communication skills, fine and gross motor, social-emotional development and problem solving. Reducing food insecurity for low-income families. Continuing learning through the summer. Helping the workforce with childcare.
