14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Funds will be used to support the operations of the environmental education programming at Busch Wildlife Sanctuary. The Environmental Education Programming will provide an opportunity to learn about nature while providing a sanctuary for wildlife and people. Busch Wildlife Sanctuary is open seven days a week with free admission. Student field trips enhance their science curriculum and students take part in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) related educational content.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

We offer a variety of public programs at the Sanctuary for students, children, and families with the goal of educating the public about native Florida wildlife and the importance of environmental conservation. We work to close the Nature Gap, a term created by the Center for American Progress to shed light on the stark reality that nature's benefits are unequally distributed by race & income.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

We offer field trips to Title 1 schools and other community groups, and travel directly to schools if there is a hardship in classes coming to visit. Exhibits and activities are highly tactile (Discovery Center interactive education activities include touch boxes, video monitors, and crawl through activities). Various height levels accommodate children, adults and physically challenged.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Grade-school children, but anyone is welcome. 10,000 plus

This unique facility offers a one-of-a-kind opportunity to learn about nature while providing a sanctuary for wildlife and people. We have something for everyone; young and old alike. From story time for parents with toddlers to family night-walks, education activities appeal to a broad range of people. Measured by the number of guests & students who visit the Sanctuary annually. Children tend to perform better on standardized tests and have fewer attendance problems if they spend time outside. Measured by the number of students from across Florida who take field trips to Busch Wildlife Sanctuary to enhance their science curriculum and take part in our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) related educational content.
