Daily programming will be robust with groups lasting well into the evening hours. The programming will also utilize a robust case management element to promote reintegration, and functionality within the community.

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### 14. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Phoenix House Florida seeks to establish an 85-bed residential program meeting the needs of a mixed population. The designed length of stay will be 60-120 days. The facility will offer programming seven days a week utilizing a variety of different resources and therapeutic interventions treating the whole patient with a continuum of services, including care for co-occurring behavioral health issues in collaboration with community partners. Daily programming will be robust, with groups lasting well into the evening hours. The programming will also utilize a robust case management element to promote reintegration and functionality within the community.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the support from the State of Florida Legislature, Phoenix House Florida will be able to afford the startup costs of an 85-bed residential rehabilitation facility for those with substance use disorder (SUD) and related mental health conditions throughout the community. With this facility, Phoenix House Florida will offer evidence-based and medication-assisted treatment to both men and women in Hillsborough County.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include medicated-assisted treatment, assessment, therapy, psychiatric services, and case management providing access to primary care, dental, and other services (peer support, supportive housing assistance, family involvement and resources within the community addressing social determinants).

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes men and women who suffer from SUD and related mental health conditions. These patients are usually in poor physical health, economically disadvantage, at-risk, homeless and/or currently/formerly incarcerated, and victims of domestic violence. With this facility, Phoenix House Florida will offer evidence-based and medication-assisted treatment to 75 men and 10 women patients, serving an estimated 300-500 patients annually, depending on length of stay.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is the improvement of mental health and drug addiction to men and women within the community who need increased access to timely integrated behavioral health and medication-assisted treatment; regain behavioral, physical and emotional health. Additionally upon completion of the program, leave with employment opportunities and supportive housing options that will support and promote her growth in recovery.
