### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Upgrading the services that USF provides to veterans, military families & first responders on each campus. Phase I (~\$6M) will fully fund renovations and additions to the existing Office of Veterans Success at USFSP as well as new technology and other upgrades at the existing USFSM office. Phase II (~\$4M in Year 1) will fund initial design for the construction of a new USF Veterans, Military Families & First Responders Service Complex at USF Tampa that will also serve USFPD and as the campus EOC.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

USF will use the funds for the design, planning and construction of remodeled and new facilities on the USF Tampa and St. Petersburg campuses for our student veterans, ROTC and first responders as well as upgrades to the S-M campus' existing office. Funds will include upgrades for facility access and mobility issues serving disabled and other student veterans.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

USF will remodel an aging facility on the USF St. Petersburg campus to materially expand the resources, and offerings for our military connected students. Funds will be used for the design & initial construction of a new facility on the USF Tampa campus to co-locate our student veterans, ROTC and first responders and include a range of wrap-around services for academic, advising & employment needs.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

University and college students, specifically veterans and military-connected students and first responders. USF has over 8,000 military connected students that will be served, along with our first responders.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

#### be measured?

USF is a national leader in veteran student success and committed to providing world-class facilities, resources, services and needs impacting over 8,000 military-connected students and first responders at USF. Additional services provided will help military-connected students to graduate on time and seek meaningful employment in high-demand areas. This support and commitment to our military-connected students increases our student retention and graduation rates, thereby generating a greater return for state taxpayers. Improve building access and mobility issues for disabled and other veterans on and around our campuses. Better enrollment, persistence and graduation rates by student veterans, including disabled student veterans, and military dependent students.
