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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of this request is to (1) provide direct assistance services for individuals with disabilities in agriculture (new/beginning, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers and their families), (2) provide Assistive Technologies and other adaptive equipment that is needed for farmers to continue working, (3) provide educational training to enhance competencies to accommodate disabilities of farmers - and to educate rehabilitation and healthcare professionals on assistive technologies.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Identify individuals with disabilities in production agriculture; Provide Assistive Technologies and other adaptive equipment that is farmers need to continue working; Educate farmers, ranchers, and farmworkers to accommodate disabilities in their work and to prevent secondary injuries; and Develop tools for selected agricultural work settings to accommodate disability.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Conduct site assessments and determine the assistive technology needs; Provide Assistive Technologies and other adaptive equipment that is farmers need to continue working; Provide training/education on AT use; Provide counseling and other needed health services farmers need and cannot afford; and provide educational tools and outreach educational materials.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Farmers with disabilities, including physical, developmental and behavioral health disabilities, as well as students with disabilities and individuals who are unemployed, wounded veterans and formerly incarcerated persons with a disability.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The services provided to the farmers will increase their physical safety and help prevent secondary injuries. Farming with disabilities can increase the risk of secondary injuries. Assistive technologies have been developed for the farmstead to help individuals maintain productivity and independence, but can also assist in the prevention of secondary injuries.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funding will be contingent on satisfaction of specific deliverables. If deliverables are not completed, payment will be deducted proportionately.
