Serving as an emergency shelter for first responders and residents during natural disasters.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Installation and upgrades of security systems will protect thousands of families and community members who will be visiting and utilizing the school campus. School shootings, emergencies and lock downs must be mitigated through proactive security measures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

More secure and safer facilities to learn, meet and serve the students, staff, parents and community. Facilities serve as emergency shelter during natural disasters for emergency responders (SunCoast Fire and Rescue, Pinellas County Sheriff's Office), and general public.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Pinellas County residents, over 2,000 kindergarten - 12th grade students, parents, at-risk youth, economically disadvantage, emergency responders (SunCoast Fire and Rescue, Pinellas County Sheriff's Office), and general public.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Secure and safe schools create a positive learning environment where thousands of students, teachers and parents can focus on student learning. Protect against violence on campus. Meet the needs of first responders during a disaster. Thousands of students, teachers and parents can focus on student learning instead of the threat of violence. First responder and the community can use the facilities for meals and shelter during a disaster.
