The agency lost over \$500,000 in fundraising revenue due to the pandemic and the ARPA funds replaced the lost fundraising dollars but were specifically used for three different employment programs: Project Search Youth, Project Search Adult and Caring Cafe. All are training programs for people with disabilities to acquire skills for long term employment outcomes.

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The Therapeutic Intervention Program (TIP) Center will train individuals with I/DD to live and thrive as a contributing member of the community while being valued for one's abilities and uniqueness, regardless of disability. The goal of community inclusion is the participation of people with I/DD across a range of areas, including: employment, housing, education, recreation and leisure, civic engagement, peer support.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Therapeutic Intervention Program is a unique, collaborative effort encompassing six professional disciplines, (behavioral, physical, occupational, speech, recreation, and music therapies), providing intense and direct treatment services for children and adults with I/DD across a range of areas, including employment, housing, education, recreation and leisure, civic engagement, peer supports.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

* Implement physician-prescribed weight loss programs and strategies. * Establish individualized, exercise regimens for each client using an adaptive PE equipment. * Increase participation in community outings that require movement and are enjoyable, such as laser tag, pickle ball, and miniature golf. * Expand and individualize systems to increase clients overall embrace of program goals. * Increase ongoing staff engagement with clients who thrive on attention. * Assist and train families of emotionally unstable clients to provide their adult children with more frequent, desired, and satisfying home visits. * Establish regular attendance at and involvement with local and regional events offered by culturally diverse groups friendly to those with developmental challenges. * All clients are encouraged and supported to attend the place of worship of their, or their family's choice.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism and their families who reside in Port St. Lucie, St. Lucie West and surrounding regions.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

See 14.c. for benefits and outcomes. Methodology that outcomes will be measured are as follows: monthly weight recordings, regularly scheduled physician visits to record, blood pressure, blood levels; and overall health improvements. Mental health recordings of client sessions documenting improvements with goals. Internal staffing notes on activities and data on goals. Family surveys on family visits and how visits are impacting family. Record all community activities in case notes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures could result in loss of licensing of program and/or recoupment of appropriated funds for the project.
