#### 4. Project/Program Description

The early service engagement and preservation (ESEP) program is a non-judicial in-home family preservation service designed to engage families upon identification of present or impending danger and to reduce the risk of the child(ren) being removed from their home by a DCF child protective investigator. The family preservation case managers will initiate intensive safety management services and oversight, while the DCF protective investigator completes the Functional Family assessment and Risk assessment needed to conclude the investigation. The case managers are child welfare certified and trained in Wraparound and Motivational Interviewing and utilize evidence-based practices to design a plan with the family that addresses both immediate safety needs and long-term mitigation of risk factors for abuse and neglect. The program is modeled after a successful program operated by Family Support Services of North Florida (FSS), which maintains one of the lowest shelter rates in the state.

#### 14. Program Performance



#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Reduce the number of children who are removed from their homes into foster care in Circuit 19. Circuit 19 has experienced a 30% increase in the number of children entering foster care in the last 24 months. Nearly 70% of the shelters are from St. Lucie County, which is experiencing ongoing population growth.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An intensive in-home family preservation service that reduces the risk of the child(ren) being removed from their home by a DCF child protective investigator. The child welfare certified case managers are Wraparound and Motivational Interviewing trained and will design a plan with the family that addresses both immediate safety needs and long-term mitigation of risk factors for abuse and neglect.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The family and case manager will develop a plan tailored to the unique needs of the family. The plan will be sequenced according to the most critical presenting problem, and will utilize the full array of safety management services, parenting, substance abuse treatment, family therapy and peer support services available in our community. Services will be provided for up to six months.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

St. Lucie County Children and their families who are at imminent risk of placement in foster care.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

75% of families served will not experience abuse neglect or safety plan breakdown resulting in child removal from the parent's home during services or within 12 months of successful program completion. This measure is a percent. The denominator is an unduplicated count of all clients who successfully completed services within the reporting period. The numerator is an unduplicated count of children in the denominator who were not removed from the home within 12 months of the client successfully completing the program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures could result in loss of appropriated funds for the project.
