4. Project/Program Description

The Florida-Israel Business Accelerator (FIBA), a project of the Tampa Jewish Community Centers and Federation, will continue to build on the momentum generated in previous years to further foster economic growth in Florida in the industries of hospitality, agriculture, space and healthcare. In light of the war in Israel that started on October 7, 2023, the need to protect critical data and safeguard information technology infrastructure is more important than ever. So, in 2024, FIBA will identify cutting-edge Israeli technology companies that protect sensitive data and strengthen cyber infrastructures of Florida-based businesses and governments. FIBA will also work strategically with Florida-based data management and cybersecurity companies to further solidify their product offerings with Israeli technology.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FIBA will work with its Florida industry partners to identify their technology pain-points (shortfalls) and then curate Israeli technologies that map to those needs. FIBA will then facilitate the deployment of Israeli technology to various Florida industry sectors, particularly data management and cybersecurity. This will result in a positive impact on Florida's economy by creating new jobs, Israeli companies expanding their presence in Florida, and investment dollars being raised and spent in Florida. FIBA will also continue to connect innovative technology solutions from Israel with Florida's tourism, hospitality and retail industries, as well as with partners in space, agriculture and health care in order to address their most pressing operational challenges.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FIBA will coordinate with its key industry partners in Florida in order to determine their most pressing challenges. This endeavor will focus on the Sarasota-Manatee area with statewide application, working with key business and government entities. The project will include identifying and connecting proven Israeli technology companies to these Florida-based industry partners in need of innovative solutions to address critical needs, particularly in the areas of data security. Activities will also include building partnerships between Israeli and Florida companies and investors in order to encourage Israeli companies to open US subsidiaries in Florida thus creating high-skilled/high-wage jobs; and continue collaborating with Florida economic development and entrepreneurial support organizations to provide resources to Israeli companies looking to grow their businesses in Florida.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

As Florida continues to experience exponential demographic and economic growth, Florida's businesses and governments are experiencing increased demands for their services. Accompanying this growth is the heightened need for these entities to keep their customers', patients' and constituents' private information safe within its institutions. Israeli technological advances in the areas of data management and cybersecurity will help these businesses and governments to address these data security challenges which will benefit all Floridians by helping to keep their personal information private and secure.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Statewide, the population will be positively impacted by the deployment of proven Israeli technology that enhances the security and tightens the access to sensitive personal data that is shared with a business or government in Florida. In addition, the statewide population - and people employed in - some of Florida's key industries including hospitality/retail, agriculture, cybersecurity and healthcare will benefit from efficiencies gained through the use of Israeli innovation in these fields. FIBA will address cross-industry challenges including labor shortages, employee burnout, employee and customer safety, customer loyalty and remote access to personal and professional services - all of which will impact Florida residents statewide.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Methodology includes partnering with key Florida industry sectors to identify their immediate technology needs in order to connect them with technology from Israel that solves critical business challenges. Benefit is that the general public will experience the efficiencies and effectiveness of improved operations across many Florida-based businesses and governments. Florida will benefit economically as well as more Israeli companies will open offices and create jobs in Florida.
