14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Funding will grant seniors increased access to medical care, socialization, congregate meal sites, and local outings by offering extended transportation options during the week and weekends. Senior's overall health outcomes will improve by providing a balanced daily breakfast. To date more than 300 trips have been completed to over 40 local attractions. Over 3600 balanced breakfasts have been served in two Miramar locations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Continue providing evening and weekend transportation services to medical appointments (including dialysis appointments), prescription drug pickup/delivery, shopping, and community outings, with over 300 trips completed to date serving 150 unduplicated seniors.

Daily breakfast and nutrition education will continue with over 3600 breakfasts served to date.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Transportation services to access healthcare, health and wellness, individual and group counseling, nutrition, recreation and socialization will p[ositively impact 150 seniors daily.

83 daily breakfasts will be served to seniors at risk for food insecurity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Low-income, frail elders 60 years of age and older, persons with poor physical and mental health, and developmentally and physically disabled persons. Expect to serve 125 individuals daily, Monday through Friday (250 days/year)

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Approximately 125 seniors daily will experience Improvements in blood pressure, improved endurance, balance, mobility and flexibility. 83 seniors will gain access to a nutritious breakfast daily. Results will be measured by client assessment, tracking of vital signs, and number of seniors receiving daily breakfast. Senior self reports will show that 100% of participating seniors will have decreased isolation and loneliness and 95% of seniors will report improved mood and increase in positive mental health outcomes. 10-30 seniors will gain access to local cultural exhibits, festivals, and historic locations each week as indicated in attendance logs.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Penalty for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures would result in return of funds or non-reimbursement.
