a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Florida Gateway Collegiate Academy will be a charter CTE High School located on the Columbia County campus of Florida Gateway College. The mission of the Florida Gateway Collegiate Academy is to provide superior instruction, nurture individual development and prepare high school students with an innovative combination of secondary and post-secondary education. The Academy serves motivated students intent on earning college CTE credentials in conjunction with a high school diploma.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The charter CTE academy for high school students will give them the opportunity to earn their high school diploma, Associate of Science Degree, and up to 7 technical certificates in career-ready technical fields.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Florida Gateway Collegiate Academy will improve the quality of education in Columbia County by offering high school students a High School Diploma, Associates of Science Degree, and an opportunity to earn up to 7 technical certificates. In turn, those graduates will contribute to the in-demand CTE workforce needs of the surrounding communities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The number of students enrolled in Florida Gateway Collegiate Academy will measure the outcome. 75 high school students (grade 9) are projected to be enrolled in the first year of the program and 300 high school students (grades 9-12) are projected to be enrolled by Year 4, and year thereafter.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase number of high school diplomas, industry certifications, workforce credentials, and degrees earned by high school students and community members and fill in-demand workforce needs in a variety of fields, such as Automotive, Criminal Justice, Water Resources, Horticulture, HVAC, Nursing Assistant, Cyber Security and more. Florida Gateway College can track employment and hiring metrics within the community.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables will result in a return of funds for administering agency.
